Sunnylands Principles (June 2020)

Plan for Action for Democratic Partnership for open, free, transparent, accountable, inclusive, peaceful and prosperous Indo-Pacific

- ① Defend civic space: participation of all stakeholders
- 2 Actively <u>support democracy</u> at home and in the neighborhood
- ③ Adopt a <u>holistic approach</u>: diplomacy, defense, economic policy, development, and trade
- (4) Engage <u>multilateral bodies and fora</u>
- **(5)** Promote <u>equitable and inclusive growth</u>
- **(6)** Use inclusive approaches and <u>involve women</u>
- ⑦ Empower young people to participate in political and civic life
- **(8)** Work with the <u>private sector</u>: Business and Human Rights
- Prioritize technology governance
- Support independent media




QI: Impact of COVID 19 and war in Ukraine on freedom and Human Rights






